5. List all the things we once were, according to 3:3.

6. What happened to change all that? How did it happen?

7. Write a definition for "justified" or "justification" from a Bible dictionary or similar resource. Find and list 3 other passages about justification.

8. What point does Paul make in verse 8 and repeat in verse 14? What does this mean?  
How can you do this?

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Discussion Questions

1. Recall as a group the main themes of each chapter of Titus. What has God taught you from this book?

2. What does it mean to devote oneself? How can you "devote yourself to good works"? (v. 1, 8, 14)

3. Have you ever seen the circumstance described in verse 10 happen in a church? If so, how was it handled? What was the result? If not, why do you think that is?

4. Read Titus 3:1-2 again. Does all that sound daunting? How do we meet that standard? Read Romans 6:12-14; 7:5-6; 8:12-13.
