Intensive Study Questions

1. Skim 1 Samuel 16 – 1 Kings 2, noting particularly the topical headings in your Bible. List at least 5 spiritual highs (instances in which David exhibited great faithfulness to God and His Word) and at least 5 spiritual lows (instances in which David exhibited great unfaithfulness to God and His Word).
2. Reflect on your own life. List at least 5 spiritual highs (instances in which you have exhibited faithfulness to God and His Word) and at least 5 spiritual lows (instances in which you exhibited unfaithfulness to God and His Word). These are your own reflections and do not have to be shared in the group unless you choose to share them.
3. Read James 2:10. What does this verse say about the assessment of David's life and our life from this standard? What do you think about this standard? This is God's Standard. Is this the standard the world uses?
4. Read 1 Samuel 13:14 and Acts 13:22. How did God describe David? How could he describe him that way?
5. Read Galatians 3:10-14 and Romans 4:5-8. What does this say about us? Can we be women after God's own Heart just like David was a man after God's own heart?
6. David was committed to preparing the next generation to receive the gifts that would help them continue building the Kingdom of God. What gifts of preparation have you received from previous generations that have equipped you to continue the building process?
7. What are some of the ways that you are (or could) begin to make preparations to pass on the legacy to the next generation of building the Kingdom of God?
8. What are some teachings from the lecture that you found particularly insightful or helpful?
