1. Paul addresses Timothy as "my dear son". Using your Bible, look up the references to Timothy from Acts 16; 1 Cor. 4:17 and 16:10; 1 Timothy 1:3, 1 Thess.1:1, 2nd Thess. 1:1, and Philemon 1. What do these passages tell us about Timothy's personality and experiences with Paul? Why do you think Paul came to love Timothy as a son?
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4. Timothy's mother Eunice and grandmother Lois both taught and lived out the scriptures, making a powerful impression on this young boy. Timothy's father was a Greek and an unbeliever (Acts 16:1). Why is it important both to DO and to SAY to our children what the scriptures teach?
5. This passage tells us that God has given us a spirit of power, love and self-discipline. What should we do if we do not see those effects in our lives? Does it mean we are not saved? If Christ's new nature is in us, we have power, love and self-discipline as an outcome of that new nature, so what must we do to exercise that new nature?
